

In their article, which begins on page 166, John Zentner and his coauthors discuss the implementation costs of this type of wetland restoration and several others including salt marshes, freshwater marshes, perennial marshes, wet meadows, and riparian woodlands. As they point out, costs for such projects are poorly documented despite more than 20 years of this type of restoration work. In addition to discussing costs, their article provides practical advice about various aspects of grading and planting wetlands and riparian woodlands. The authors also explain why the costs of wetland restoration vary according to the type of organization (private sector, non-profit, public sector) that is seeking to have a wetland restored.
